**THE MARINE WORKS (ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT ASSESSMENT) (SCOTLAND)
REGULATIONS 2017 (AS AMENDED)**

Notice is hereby given that Stornoway Port Authority of Amity House, Esplanade Quay, Stornoway HS1 2XS, have applied to the Scottish Ministers for marine licences under section 20 of the Marine (Scotland) Act 2010 to construct a deep water port and undertake dredging at Glumaig Bay, Stornoway. Any representations should be made in writing to the consenting authority by email to: ms.marinelicensing@gov.scot or by post to The Scottish Government, Marine Scotland Licensing Operations Team, Marine Laboratory, 375 Victoria Road, Aberdeen, AB11 9DB, identifying the proposed works and specifying grounds for objection or support, not later than **Friday 26th July 2019**. The Scottish Ministers may consider representations received after this date. Representations should be dated and clearly state the name (in block capitals) and the full return email or postal address of those making the representation.

Subsequent submission by Stornoway Port Authority of additional information to the Scottish Ministers will be publicised in a similar manner to the current application including publication on the above websites. Representations relative to additional information should be made on the same basis as detailed above.

Having considered an application for a marine licence under section 20 of the Marine (Scotland) Act 2010 and the 2017 MW Regulations the Scottish Ministers may:-

- grant marine licences with or without conditions attached; or
- refuse the applications.

Fair Processing Notice

The Scottish Government’s Marine Scotland - Licensing Operations Team (“MS-LOT”) processes applications under the Marine (Scotland) Act 2010. During the consultation process written representations can be sent to the Scottish Ministers.

Should the Scottish Ministers call a Public Local Inquiry (“PLI”) copies of representations will be sent to the Directorate of Planning and Environmental Appeals for the Reporter to consider during the inquiry. These representations will be posted on their website but will not publish your personal data (e.g. your name and address) as this is removed beforehand in compliance with the Data Protection Act 1998.

You can choose to mark your representation as confidential, in which case it will only be considered by the Scottish Ministers and will not be shared with the planning authority, the applicant, the Reporter (should a PLI be called) or any other third party.
