For the purposes of this Schedule:

- A. The “harbour” means the harbour of Stornoway as defined by the Stornoway Harbour Act and Orders 1976 to 2019 as the same may be amended.
- B. The “Authority” means Stornoway Port Authority.
- C. “Week” means the period from midnight on Sunday to midnight on the following Sunday.
- D. Fishing Vessels, electing not to pay composite dues, shall submit monthly landing declarations and will be charged ad-valorem dues on the value in accordance with paragraph 2.4. In the event of failure to do so, the ad-valorem charge will be charged at the level of the highest ad-valorem charge made in the immediately preceding month.
- E. Vessel dues shall apply to all vessels entering the harbour.
- F. Tonnage means the vessel’s gross tonnage (“G.T.”) calculated in accordance with the International Tonnage Convention 1969 or the Merchant Shipping (Tonnage) Regulations 1997 as amended.
- G. “The Outer Harbour” means that part of the harbour lying south of a line drawn east-west through the light at Arnish Point, which includes the approaches to the Harbour but excludes Glumaig Harbour.
- H. “The Middle Harbour” means the waters lying between a line drawn east-west through the light at Arnish Point at the south and a line drawn east-west through the 2FG light on the northern end of Goat Island slip.
- I. The boundary for compulsory pilotage is a line drawn due east from Arnish Point lighthouse to Holm (58° 11.5N).
- J. VAT at the current rate applies to all vessels under 15 G.T. and all recreation or leisure vessels.
- K. Vessels using the harbour for safety due to stress of weather and not using any quay or landing place will be free of charge for 5 days.
- L. Vessels anchoring or berthing within the harbour solely on compassionate or emergency grounds for a period of less than two hours and not using any other facilities will be free of charge.

For the purposes of this Schedule “emergency” means a sudden, unexpected or impending situation that may cause or be due to injury, loss of life or damage to property or the environment and which, accordingly, requires immediate attention and remedial action.

However if the period in port exceeds two hours and/or the vessel takes on fuel, ice, stores, water, etc., the normal rates scheduled will be charged.

- M. “Per day” means the period from midnight one day to midnight the following day, or part thereof, and days shall be construed accordingly.
- N. “Scheduled timetabled berthing” means the number of berthings advertised in the published timetable of the operating company of passenger and/or freight vessels.
- O. Berthing dues apply to banked vessels.
- P. All costs of rectifying environmental damage shall be recovered from the vessel concerned.
- Q. Where circumstances occur that are not covered in this Schedule of Rates and Dues application may be made to the Authority.
- R. The Authority may refuse to provide any additional services, including without limitation ice, water, use of slipway to any vessel which has not paid, in full, all outstanding amounts owed to the Authority within 45 days of rendering of the Authority’s invoice.
- S. Interest shall be charged at the judicial rate then in force on any outstanding amounts owed to the Authority on the expiry of 30 days from the rendering of the Authority’s invoice.
- T. Overtime charges apply between the hours of 11pm and 6am. The charges for overtime are as per paragraph 13.6.

Vessels or owners must disclose landing values accurately and within 28 days of the landing. Refer to Item D.

2.5 Fishing vessels – composite dues (per calendar month or part thereof)

An election to pay composite dues must be received in writing by SPA at least two weeks before the start of the calendar month from which the monthly period is to be reckoned. Such an election may also be made in writing on an annual basis. Composite dues in respect will be invoiced and payable monthly and paid before completion of the relevant monthly period.

If an invoice is not paid before the completion of a relevant monthly period, composite dues will cease to be applicable for the succeeding month or annually as the case may be, and the vessel will be liable for the charges under paragraph 2.2 and 2.4.

Composite dues will only be given on the production of proof of third party liability insurance to a minimum value of £3,000,000.

If a vessel is to leave the harbour for a period of one month or longer, the vessel is required to inform the Authority no later than the 28th of the month prior to departure. Failure to do so will result in composite dues continuing to be payable after the departure of the vessel.

The beam of multi-hulled vessels will be assessed upon arrival, but will generally be liable to a minimum of an additional 50% extra on all the dues in Part 3.

When a pilot is requested and if the request is cancelled after the pilot has set out to undertake the pilotage.
